## Speaker Details



**Dr Jon Salsberg** is Senior Lecturer in Primary Health Care Research – Public & Patient Involvement (PPI), in the University of Limerick's School of Medicine. Jon is a co-investigator on the HRB-funded PPI Ignite@UL, and site lead for UL's participation in the HRB's National PPI Network. Jon is co-author of Canada's Guide to Researcher and Knowledge-User Collaboration in Health Research, and was a founding member of Participatory Research at McGill University, Montreal, Canada. Jon has undertaken partnered research involving a broad range of stakeholders including patients, health practitioners, community organisations, policy makers and health service decision-makers, and has worked extensively with Indigenous communities.



**Dr Nikki Dunne** joined Family Carers Ireland in March 2019. As the organisation's Research Officer, she leads Family Carers Ireland's programme of research and manages a diverse range of qualitative and quantitative projects relating to family carers. She is particularly focusing on building and coordinating research involvement and engagement among family carers, researchers and other stakeholders.



Jo Bergin is a family carer and mother to three children, aged 11, 13 and 29, all of whom have special needs. She has a background in nursing for over 20 years and also has experience as a care assistant. Jo has an interest in research that makes a difference to the lives of carers and the people with special needs and is passionate about having the carers' voice included in research in a meaningful way. Jo has first-hand knowledge of the difference early diagnosis and treatment can have on children and is eager to share her experience of caring without proper supports in place.



Aisling Harmon returned to Ireland in 2006 to care for her father with Alzheimer's disease, and now her mother with advanced Parkinson's disease and dementia. Recently retired from 16 years osteopathic private practice, she has a keen interest in PPI and the translation of research to policy and soon hopes to resume Post Grad study interrupted by Covid Pandemic. She has key transferable academic and clinical skills from her former practitioner and teaching roles. She has extensive PPI experience as Expert Panellist/ Speaker/ Advocate/ ResearchParticipant/Project Advisory Group representative/ HRB Funding Co-Applicant across a broad audience ranging from Academia to Not for Profit sectors, and contributing to policy dialogue with public and state bodies.
